Financial aid helps make a world-class education at Berkeley a reality.

TYPES OF FINANCIAL AID

- Scholarships: Awarded on the basis of academic merit combined with financial need.
- ▶ **Grants:** Awarded on the basis of financial need and do not need to be repaid.
- Loans: Borrowed funds repaid over a period of time, usually after you leave school and with interest.
- Work-study: Awarded on the basis of financial need that you may earn by working at a parttime job.

FINANCIAL AID OPPORTUNITIES

Blue and Gold Opportunity Plan: The University of California Blue and Gold Opportunity Plan makes college more affordable for California residents.

This plan ensures that UC tuition & fees are completely covered by a combination of scholarships and grants for California residents. Families who have an annual income up to \$80,000, and who meet all aid eligibility requirements, qualify.

California Dream Act Student Financial Aid:

Students who are not eligible to file a FAFSA and who qualify for a Nonresident Supplemental Tuition exemption (AB 540) should apply for aid by completing the California Dream Act Application available at: **dream.csac.ca.gov**.

Priority deadline is March 2.

California Dream Act students are eligible for Cal Grants, UC Berkeley grants, scholarships, and loans, California Dream Loan, work-study, and external scholarships.

Middle Class Scholarship (MCS): The Middle Class Scholarship is for California resident undergraduates with family incomes and assets up to \$171,000.

Scholarship amounts are determined by the California Student Aid Commission and are based on a sliding scale measured by family income and the other types of financial aid a student is receiving.

SEARCHING FOR SCHOLARSHIPS

UC Berkeley Scholarships: The University identifies eligible students with information provided on the UC Application for Admissions and Scholarships. No separate application is required. For more information, visit: financialaid. berkeley.edu

- Berkeley Undergraduate Scholarships: Awarded on the basis of academic merit and financial need.
- Regents' and Chancellor's Scholarships: Highly prestigious, renewable awards made to top entering freshmen and transfer students based on outstanding achievements, regardless of financial need.
- Fiat Lux: Awarded to high-achieving, resilient students from local high schools in the Bay Area, Central Coast, San Jose, Sequoia, Sacramento, and Los Angeles.

External Scholarships: UC Berkeley students are awarded more than \$10 million annually in external scholarships. We strongly encourage every student to apply for external scholarships each year. Remember to report all external scholarships online via CalCentral.

APPLYING FOR FINANCIAL AID

- U.S. citizens and eligible noncitizens, complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
- Students not eligible for FAFSA may be eligible to apply via the California Dream Act Application.

- Submit a Cal Grant GPA Verification Form to the California Student Aid Commission by March 2.
- Priority Deadline for aid applications is March 2.

FINANCIAL AID TIPS

- When applying for aid, include UC Berkeley's federal school code oo1312.
- Review your Student Aid Report (SAR) or CalSAR carefully. Make sure information you submit is correct.
- Make corrections to applications and submit requested documents as soon as possible.
- With any communication (emails, documents, and/or applications) to the financial aid office, always include your student ID number, not your Social Security number.
