Cost of Attendance Financial Aid Guide

Cost of attendance refers to *the estimated expenses associated with college attendance that a student can expect to accrue for a specified period of enrollment*. Each college/university awarding federal financial aid publishes an estimated cost of attendance to help students and families understand the expenses associated with college attendance. A student's assigned cost of attendance is the foundation for determining **financial need** and the amount of qualified aid that can be offered.

Components and Costs

Cost of attendance is updated annually with input from student surveys and research. **Cost of attendance components** include *tuition and fees; books, course materials, supplies, and equipment; living expenses (food and housing); miscellaneous and personal expenses; transportation; and health insurance.*

These components can be categorized as **direct costs** and **indirect costs**.

Direct costs are expenses charged directly by the university. Tuition and campus fees are charged by the university and are considered **direct costs**. Charges can be viewed in CalCentral.

Indirect costs are student expenses from other sources. For example, items purchased for living on campus, like storage boxes and bed linens, are indirect costs.

Depending on a student's selected housing type, some expenses can be either a direct or indirect cost. For students living in campus housing, the housing and food expense is a **direct cost** and the charge is viewable in CalCentral. For students in an offcampus apartment, this expense is an **indirect cost**.

Adjustments and Appeals

 If a student's actual expenses exceed their assigned cost, a <u>Cost of</u> <u>Attendance Adjustment</u> may be considered (typically for unexpected budgetary needs).
